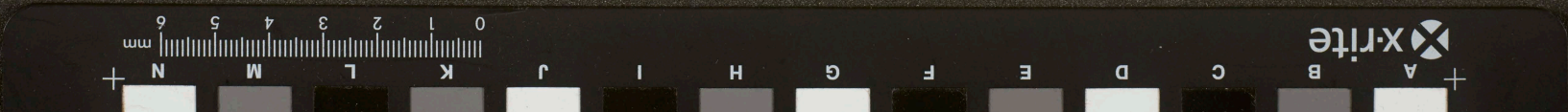

Respect Person, & that you may

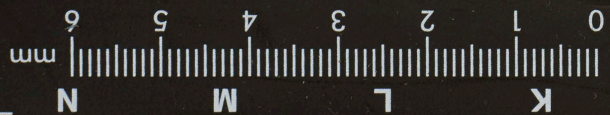
see many happy ones — My Son
