first moment I can snatch is at a quarter
before ten Sunday Night, I am writing
to you from my own room, which I
am delighted with & where I hope we
shall in due time spend some comfortable
hours together, I hope to hear this
day has been a happy one to you
& that no unhappy expression has
embittered it, believe me my Dear I
most heartily & sincerely wish your
happiness, thorns there are in every
state, but as contented mind I have

by experience gathers the Bores notwithstanding
such I am sure yours is.

We arrived safe at the castle at
Lurn last Night, & spent the 6 & 7
till 9 as usual, this Morn'g at right
or all sent to the Chapel, after
breakfasted in Mr. Hagendorf's
new Room, with Genl. Freitag Genl.
Buck's Col. Mottam & Mr. Bernall
The King's Son-in-law & all their
Gentlemen afterwards took their
walk, & the Queen read us a sermon
by Charlotte & by Agreement
attending nothing worth relating
passed from that hour till near

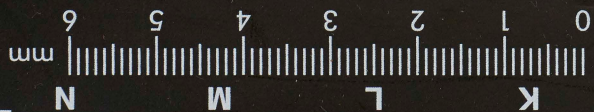
there, when we proceeded to the Castle
