Your letter my Dear dated the 23^d has but

imagine what very uncomfortable state my mind
is in - as in that letter I learn that my dear
friend is ill & that you would send me accounts
of her in a day or two - pray fail not to
write by return of Post - & direct to me under
Cover to Mr. Wm at Carteen Hall for I go there
on Friday with Lady Wake for a few days -
I beg that you will tell me every thing concerning
her illness & conceal nothing from me - I am
extremely glad you are with your dear sister
for I know how tenderly
you love her & with what
care you will attend her.

Let me know whether she has had a
Physician - and whether this bad illness has
brought on the old complaint in her Stomach.
I entreat once more that you will send me
a true & faithful account. I wrote to your
sister the 15th & hope she rec^d my letter.

Mr. Wm Wake has been confin'd by the gout ever
since the tenth of this month - he is now recovering
but is still carried up & down stairs - Lady Wake
is pretty well in health but her spirits are
much depressed by the constant state of anxiety
she is in on her husband's account - he shall
only be absent from this place four days ^{only} - & by
W - & I, ^{& Richard} go into Northamptonshire the
reason of this journey is to take little Richard
to school. I wish you would endow me by

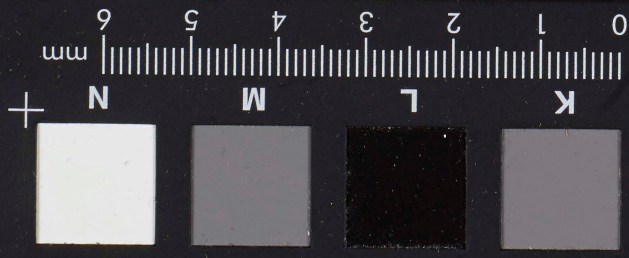
